# Video Review: Clindamycin vs. Linezolid: Time to Rethink Therapy for Group A Strep Necrotizing Skin Infections?

The 2014 Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA) skin and soft tissue guidelines recommend penicillin and clindamycin as combination therapy for necrotizing Group A Strep skin infections. However, clindamycin use concerns including rising resistance rates and associated C. difficile infections may warrant use of an alternative agent such as linezolid over clindamycin.

Check out her study: Clinical Outcomes and Treatment Strategies in Patients With Non-Carbapenemase-producing Carbapenem-Resistant Versus Carbapenem-Susceptible Enterobacterales Infections published in Annals of Pharmacotherapy!

In this study, Dr. Debnath and colleagues found no difference in clinical outcomes between noncarbapenemase-producing CRE and carbapenemsusceptible Enterobacterales infections. This study is a welcome addition to the currently limited literature on management and outcomes of noncarbapenemase-producing CRE.

Currently, Dr. Debnath is an infectious diseases clinical pharmacy specialist at Community Medical Center in Toms River, NJ.
