

Today we feature Cassandra (Cassie) Karas, PharmD, BCIDP, former PGY1 Pharmacy Resident at East Alabama Medical Center.

Check out her study: Evaluating the Safety of Trough Versus Area Under the Curve (AUC)-Based Dosing Method of Vancomycin With Concomitant Piperacillin-Tazobactam published in the Journal of Pharmacy Technology

In this multi-center, retrospective study, Dr. Karas and colleagues found no difference in acute kidney injury (AKI) with trough-based vs. AUC-based dosing of vancomycin in the setting of concomitant piperacillin-tazobactam, though acknowledged the need for further study in this area.

Currently, Dr. Karas is an pharmacist at East Alabama Medical Center in Opelika, AL.
