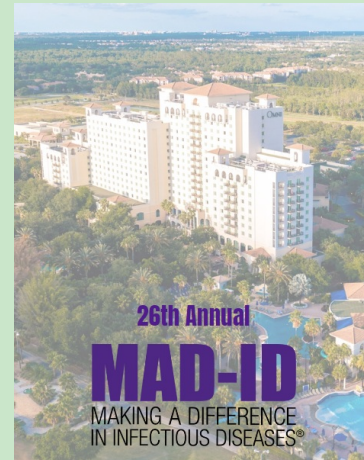

MAD-ID Announces MAD-ID 2024 Keynote Speaker: Dr. Martin Blaser

MAD-ID is excited to announce keynote speaker Martin Blaser, MD who will speak on the role of the **microbiome in antimicrobial stewardship**.

Dr. Blaser holds the Henry Rutgers Chair of the Human Microbiome at Rutgers University and serves as Director of the Center for Advanced Biotechnology and Medicine. Dr. Blaser is a leading researcher studying the interface between the microbiome and human disease.

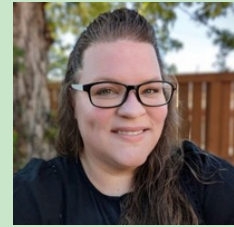
He currently serves as Chair of the Presidential Advisory Council for Combating Antibiotic Resistant Bacteria (PACCARB). He holds 28 U.S. patents, and has authored over 600 original articles. He wrote *Missing Microbes*, a book targeted to general audiences, now translated into 20 languages.

MAD-ID Members in the Literature: Dr. Allison M. Field

Congratulations to Dr. Allison Field, PharmD, BCIDP, AAHIVP and colleagues for publishing their study entitled "Single-Dose Antibiotic Prophylaxis with Ertapenem Increases Compliance with Recommendations for Surgical Antibiotic Prophylaxis in Elective Colorectal Surgery: A Retrospective, Single-Center Analysis"

In their retrospective study of adult patients undergoing elective colorectal surgery, Dr. Field and colleagues found higher rates of adherence to guideline recommendations for single-dose antibiotic prophylaxis in those receiving ertapenem for prophylaxis compared to those receiving standard of care antibiotics.
