Today we feature **Ethan Rausch, PharmD**, Antimicrobial Stewardship and Infectious Diseases Pharmacist within the Antimicrobial Support Network at Atrium Health

Check out Ethan's study: Eravacycline Associated Hypofibrinogenemia: A Case Series of Transplant Patients With Mycobacterium Abscessus Infections and Review of Literature published in Open Forum Infectious Diseases.

In this study, Dr. Rausch and colleagues are the first to report six cases of eravacycline-associated hypofibrinogenemia. They assess its clinical significance and provide considerations for clinicians regarding laboratory monitoring and outcomes for patients receiving eravacycline.
